REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP)
RFP-23-UA-2023**

Subject Matter Experts on Radiological and Nuclear Critical Infrastructure Protection, Virtual and In-Person Engagements Focusing on Insider Threat Identification and Mitigation at facilities and organizations with access to high-activity radiological material.

Submission Deadline: November 9th 2023, 6 pm (UTC+02:00) Helsinki, Kyiv, Riga, Sofia, Tallinn, Vilnius.

Summary:

CRDF Global is seeking subject matter experts (hereafter “SMEs”) with experience developing and delivering instructions, both virtually and in person, to government, academia and private sector stakeholders on security of radiological and nuclear facilities in Ukraine. These engagements will enhance the capacities of the critical infrastructure workforce to address and mitigate risks from insider threats at nuclear and radiological facilities.

Above mentioned subject matter experts’ tasks would be mostly concentrated on providing certain radiological and nuclear critical infrastructure protection advising services for the project activities implemented by providing guidance and support. The expert will deliver that in a manner aligned with CRDF Global project goals and objectives and customers specific requirements.

CRDF Global plans to implement these engagements between November 2023 and January 2025 which requires on-going, flexible, and lasting partnerships with experts in the field.

Scope of Work:

The subject matter expert will provide overall organizational support, facilitate virtual and in-person engagements focusing on insider threat identification and mitigation at facilities and organizations with access to high-activity radiological material and develop technical virtual and workshop materials. In addition, the SME will engage in knowledge-sharing activities with participants in consultation and with guidance from CRDF staff and governmental stakeholders.

SME Requirements:

The SME will have experience developing and delivering e-learning courses, workshops, webinars and in-person training on radiological and nuclear security focusing on insider threat identification and mitigation. The contractor will have a demonstrated capability to conduct the above-mentioned activities or more of the following areas:

- I. Developing materials and video recordings in English for asynchronous, online insider threat identification and mitigation training course:
 - a. preparation of power point presentations, workshop participants evaluation forms, and other training materials;*
 - b. coordination with relevant CRDF staff on arrangements for SOW activities, ensuring that necessary procedures/requirements are followed/met;**
- II. Preparing, conducting and leading discussions and virtual breakout sessions with participants of the webinar on insider threat identification and mitigation;*
- III. Developing materials and facilitating in-person workshop focusing on insider threat identification and mitigation:*

- a. *Conducting training sessions and submitting training reports that include recommendations for next steps.,*
- b. *Traveling for the in-person workshop in Ukraine, Poland or another country within Europe.*

RFP Subject Matter Expertise: **Subject Matter Experts shall have at least 7-10 years of relevant technical and professional experience. Applicable experience can include a combination of the below:**

- Master's degree in relevant area's related to radiological and nuclear critical infrastructure protection required, Ph.D. is strongly preferred;
- At least 7 - 10 years of professional experience in government or private sector relations in the field of radiological and nuclear critical infrastructure protection;
- Proven experience in developing asynchronous, online modules and courses related to the insider threat identification and mitigation for representatives of facilities and organizations with access to high-activity radiological material;
- Proven experience in preparing and conducting webinars in the field of radiological and nuclear critical infrastructure protection related to the insider threat identification and mitigation;
- Proven experience in developing/supervising/implementing/moderating radiological, nuclear critical infrastructure protection themed seminars/workshops;
- Experience in the Post-Soviet countries, USA and Europe in general are preferred;
- Excellent knowledge of Ukrainian, US and Eastern Europe situation in radiological, nuclear critical infrastructure protection field;
- Proven experience of collaboration with government entities, private sector and civil society actors is a strong asset;
- Strong writing and speaking skills in Ukrainian and English required for Ukrainian SMEs; For international experts, only strong writing and speaking English language skills are required;
- Proven experience working on donor-funded projects, especially for the U.S. government or multilateral institutions.

Proposal Requirements:

Each proposal must include:

1. Statement of Interest and Technical Capabilities
 - o Detailed description of the services offered in correlation with the RFP Subject Matter Expertise detailed under **SME Requirements**;
 - o List of recent experiences working with donor-funded projects, especially for U.S. Government;
 - o Resumes (no more than 2 pages)
2. Cost proposal (recommended, but optional)
 - o Description of the pricing and cost factors (e.g. hourly rates, fixed-cost pricing on standard services, and etc), that the SME would be willing to negotiate under the GSC.
3. Completion & online submission of CRDF Global's Contractor Data Form
